## Debutante Ball fetes community involvement

Saturday night's Debutante Ball is a celebration of a group of young community-spirited women who have volunteered in many areas.

Hosted at the Sarasota Municipal Auditorium, the Ball is also a fund-raiser for the Florida Youth Symphony.

This year's young debutantes were invited in the spring of their junior year based on their academic achievement, school involvement and community service and asked to attend a special tea by the committee organizing the event.

"The committee consists of about 20 members representing all the different schools that meet once a month," said Kim McCabe, head of publicity for the event. "At the tea, we discussed the procedure of the ball and the cost involved, so the girls could make decisions."

The girls all devote a considerable amount of time volunteering in the community. That makes them special, organizers say.

"Their marvelous work volunteering at local hospitals, churches and other local organizations, such as the Sarasota All Children's Hospital Guild, is an inspiration," said Stephen LeBlanc, who photographed the debutantes as part of an exhibit currently on display at Westfield Southgate Mall.

Lauren Turner, daughter of Karen and Jim Turner, a senior in the International Baccalaureate Program at

Riverview High School, is a typical candidate.

Lauren served as president of SADD (Students Against Destructive Decisions) and showcased her musical talents in a variety of venues, ranging from the Riverview High School Chorus to the Sarasota Youth Opera. She has been an All-State Musician for four years and pronounced one of the 25 top high school alums in Florida.

"The Debutante Program is a wonderful experience for us all," Lauren said. "I'm grateful for the opportunity to attend the many fun Deb parties, some in costume, with my parents and other family members and friends."

"The waltz lessons with dads and daughters are so much fun. I can't wait for the ball," she added. "It was a very magical evening for my sister, Leah, when she was a Deb three years ago."

"It's very traditional," said Lauren's mother, Karen Turner. "The girls are all in white ... and they carry a dozen red roses."

"No one else at the Ball wears white," she added. "They are escorted by their fathers to the stage, where they curtsy before he takes her arm and they dance together."

Said Jim Turner, Lauren's father: "The waltz lessons Lauren and I took through the Debutante program have been a special father and daughter time, which I will particularly cherish when she leaves for college."

Lauren plans to attend either Vanderbilt University in Nashville, Tenn., or Furman University in Greenville, S.C.

## Symphony's debutantes presented to society

The accomplishments of 15 high school seniors from Manatee and Sarasota counties will be celebrated as they are formally introduced to society this weekend.

The annual Florida West Coast Symphony Debutante Ball on Saturday at Sarasota Municipal Auditorium is the culmination of a year of activities for the girls and their families.

The symphony's Debutante Program, which began in 1981, chooses girls for their academic success, leadership ability and commitment to community service. As a fund-raiser for the symphony, the program's duration this year was \$3,000.

Throughout the year, the debutantes and their families

host and attend themed parties and social gatherings. They also learn to waltz, participate in a community service program with the Women's Exchange and serve as docents at a youth orchestra performance.

"It's really been a wonderful experience," debutante Eleni Sokos said. "I didn't know any of the other girls when we began, so it was like starting over with a new group of friends."

Her mother, Lisa, said Eleni's participation affected the entire family. "When students become seniors, you don't see much of them," she said, "but the program's activities forced the family to spend precious time together."

"Most of all, she's gotten an opportunity to spend some quality time with her father through the waltzing lessons, so that's been wonderful."

Lisa Sokos added: "They go out to dinner afterward, and she probably would not have had time to spend time with him if they had not done this."

The Norton family of Sarasota had similar experiences.

Evan Norton participated in 2002, and her sister, Lauren, is making her debut this year.

"My oldest daughter said it helps a lot, especially when they're going off to college and leaving home," said their mother, Jane. "She was way ahead of the game as far as representing herself well and being comfortable walking into a room when you don't know anyone."

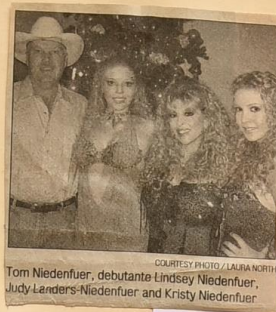




# Party a hit with teens

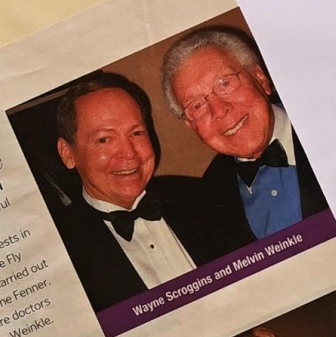

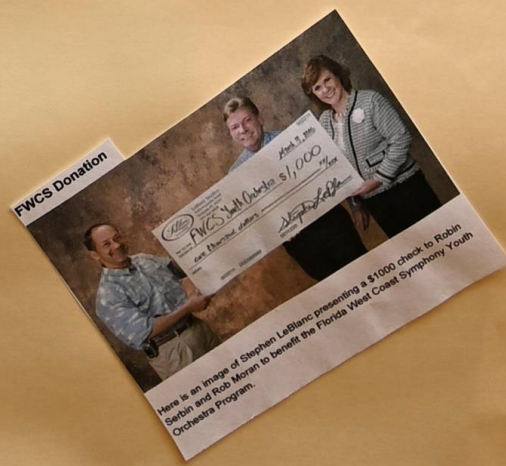
